# Snake River Jr. High School

We are pleased that Snake River Junior High has been selected to represent schools across the nation by participating in the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP). First administered in 1969, NAEP is the largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what students know and can do in various subject areas. It is administered by the National Center for Education Statistics, in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Education. The Idaho State Board of Education includes NAEP in the comprehensive state testing program (at grades 4, 8, and 12) because it gives us comparative state and national information about student achievement in reading, mathematics, science and writing. The results of NAEP are released as The Nation's Report Card, providing information about student achievement for educators, parents, policymakers, and the public.

In Snake River Junior High, the NAEP assessment will be given on February 26, 2014. Students will be selected to take a mathematics, reading, or science assessment. In addition to answering questions in one of these subjects, students will be asked questions about themselves and their educational experiences, such as the amount of reading they do and the types of classes they take. These questions provide contextual information for the assessment, as well as information that may be related to students' learning. 
#### The Three Percussionists
