## Snake River High School

### Business Class

Snake River High School is one of 25 schools in Idaho to participate in a new Adobe pilot program. The program, funded through the State Department of Education, provides Adobe Creative Cloud licenses to students, Adobe Certified Associate certification exams, and the ability to use all of the available Adobe products and online storage at no cost to the student or the school.

This pilot program is the first of its kind for Adobe. Though Adobe has been around in education for years, this is the first time that students will be able to use the products at home and have access to all of the products that Adobe offers, even phone applications. Microsoft began a similar program to offer students access to curriculum and exams with the Imagine Academy last year, and it has been successful at Snake River, with over 20 students getting Microsoft Word certified last year.

Shayla Martin, Business teacher at Snake River, is excited for the opportunity that participating in the pilot will bring to her students. Snake River currently offers a Digital Design course, where Photoshop skills are taught. She hopes to get some of these students certified, which could lead to employment opportunities for them in the future. If the pilot program is successful, more schools would be able to participate in future years. She hopes that Snake River has the support and motivation to ensure that the pilot is successful, and that Snake River can help pioneer the use of the Creative Cloud in education for the rest of the world.
