We anticipate the introduction of one-on-one chrome books for students. We are excited to see this technology introduced to enhance learning and track student growth.



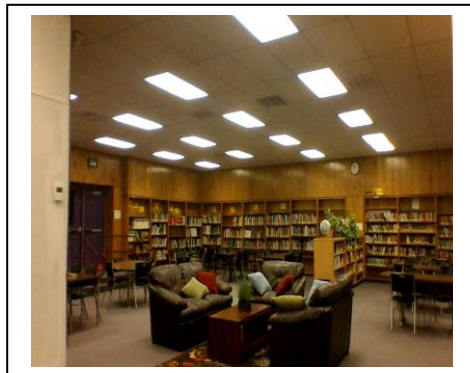

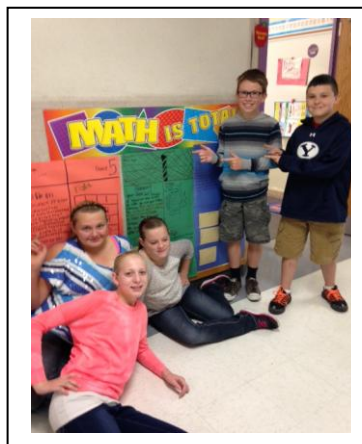
Snake River Jr. High School

Some of the courses include digital photography, foreign language, American Government, and more. Currently, 75 students are enrolled in the program, with 48 of them actively taking classes.
