The results of the ISAT are used to determine whether our school is making adequate yearly progress (AYP) to meet the goals. Schools that consecutively do not meet goals in a subject area are identified for school improvement. Under the No Child Left Behind Act parents have the opportunity to transfer their child to another school not identified for improvement.
