Policy Title: Dual Enrollment and Part-Time Attendance	Effective Date: April 11, 2017

Snake River School District 52 in accordance with Idaho Code 33-203, will allow dual enrollment opportunities for any student who is legitimately enrolled in a private, parochial, home school, or other public school, and who has not graduated from high school.

If a student wishes to attend a class in the Snake River School District, but is enrolled in another public school district that is claiming their ADA (Average Daily Attendance), the district will charge the home district a prorated tuition fee for that class based on the monthly rate shown on the state apportionment of the tuition certificate received from the Idaho Department of Education each year.

If enrollment in a specific program reaches the maximum for the program, priority for enrollment shall be given to students enrolled full time.

Students who qualify for dual enrollment may participate in district-wide testing programs. Adherence to testing procedures is required.

Charter school or homebound students participating in non-academic school activities must reside within the attendance boundaries of the district.

Students desiring to enroll in Snake River School District 52 under the Dual Enrollment option, must comply with the registration procedures required by the State Department of Education and Snake River District and provide the following information:

- 1. Evidence of residence**
- 2. Birth Certificate**
- 3. Evidence of immunizations as required by the State of Idaho**
- 4. Complete records of the student's academic history**

DUAL ENROLLMENT

General Requirements:

1. Application for Dual Enrollment will be made at the Snake River School District Office at 103 So. 900 West, Blackfoot, Idaho, 83221.
2. Students applying at the District Office will be referred to the appropriate principal for admission.
3. Students admitted to the District will be expected to comply with all district policies that are not in conflict with House Bill #171.
4. The District will not accept credits for graduation from schools that are not accredited by Northwest Accreditation or approved school reciprocal agency.
5. Transportation is the responsibility of the parents unless established routes have space to accommodate the dual enrollment student.
6. Dual enrollment students are to arrive at their scheduled classes no sooner than 10 minutes before the class starting time, unless it is the beginning of the day or lunch time, and they are to leave immediately after classes are completed. If there is a time lapse between the classes the student is attending, the parents of the student will pick the student up and return them to school when the next class begins.
7. Students must meet Snake River School District Graduation requirements in order to graduate.
8. Areas not covered by this procedure will be referred to the school administration for resolution.

School Day Curriculum:

1. Students will be allowed to enroll on the first day of school for each time period in which credit is given, provided the class has not reached the maximum enrollment.
2. Once a student is enrolled, they will be able to retain their place in the class for the trimester or semester for which credit is earned.
3. The students will follow the same rules, regulations, and procedures as regularly enrolled students.

Activity Program:

1. Dual enrollment students will be allowed to participate in those activities that occur while they are at the school.
2. Dual enrollment students will be expected to meet the same fee requirements as the regularly enrolled students; since this means purchasing a student body card, the student will have all the rights of the student body card for after school activities.
3. If the activity involves a tryout for membership, the student will accept the judgment of the advisors and coaches involved and will not be given a spot unless they earn it through tryouts.
4. Students selected to participate in activities sponsored by the Idaho High School Activities Association will comply with the regulations of the IHSAA that are not in conflict with House Bill 171 and the procedures outlined by the IHSAA's "Private and Home School Eligibility" effective July 1, 1995.
